- Minutes:** Motion by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee Strong and carried, to accept the minutes of the previous meeting.
- Tentative Budget Hearing:** Clerk mentioned again as previously indicated in the organization meeting, that a Public Hearing would be held on April 15, 1975, at 7:30 P.M.E.D.S.T. relative to a tentative budget. Clerk pointed out that following the hearing, should the board wish to add to or eliminate any items in the budget, that this would be permissible. However, the budget must be adopted by May 1st, preferably at the next village board meeting on April 21, 1975.
- Police Report:** Motion by Trustee McGuire, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried, to accept the Police Report for the month of March, 1975. Highlights of the report revealed that 138 complaints were taken care of during the month, along with six (6) burglary 3rd degree, thirty-two (32) apprehended for speeding, and eleven (11) illegally parked. Total fines and bail forfeitures collected for the month for motor vehicle and criminal arrests amounted to \$480.00.
- Mormon Dinner:** Due to the storm on April 4th, the dinner planned by the Elder Clove and his wife at the Garlock House was cancelled. They have now suggested April 26th. Board members agreed this satisfactory. Clerk asked to so advise them.
- Evaluat. Form. re: Employees:** Trustee Strong presented forms that are used at the University of Rochester relative to an employees work procedures, attitudes, and general aptitude for the position so assigned. It would be his suggestion that a form of this type be considered to be prepared for all village employees to be reviewed annually.
- Potter Sign:** Village Attorney Poyzer advised that Mr. M. Strobbridge, attorney for Lawrence Potter, owner of the Laundromat, whose sign has been in violation for some time, and Bruce Wideman, Zoning Officer, were to re-schedule a meeting, as previously there had been a misunderstanding of the scheduled time.
- PVA & PEOS:** A general discussion of the Palmyra Volunteer Ambulance and the Palmyra Emergency Oxygen Squad, the latter being a part of the Palmyra Volunteer Fire Department. Areas to be covered in an agreement would be difficult in view of the fact that the Palmyra Fire Department has a responsibility to cover the area of Armington Road, north side, which is in the Town of Manchester. No decision on the matter of the agreements drawn by Mayor Fitzgerald for future signatures, by both units.

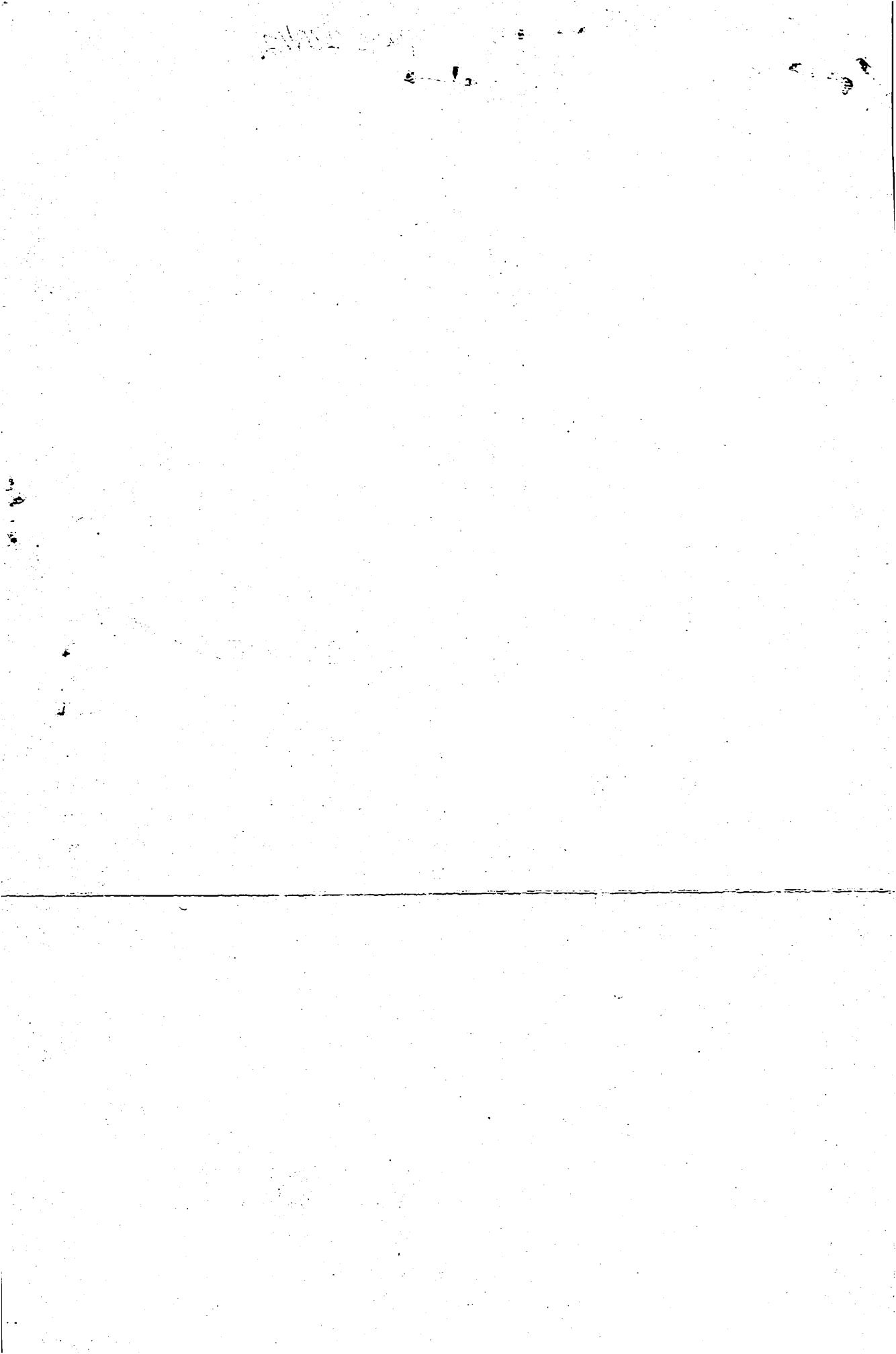

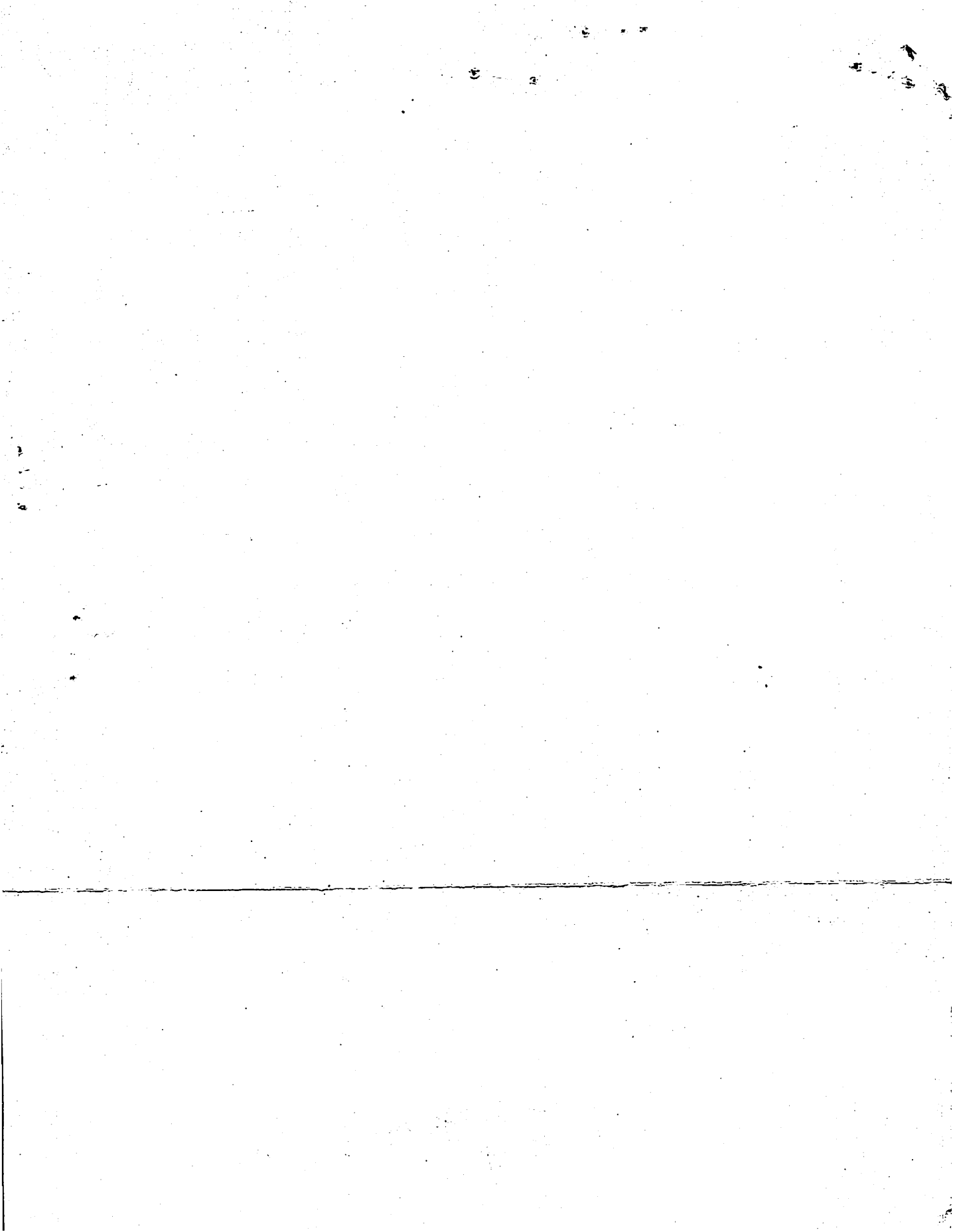

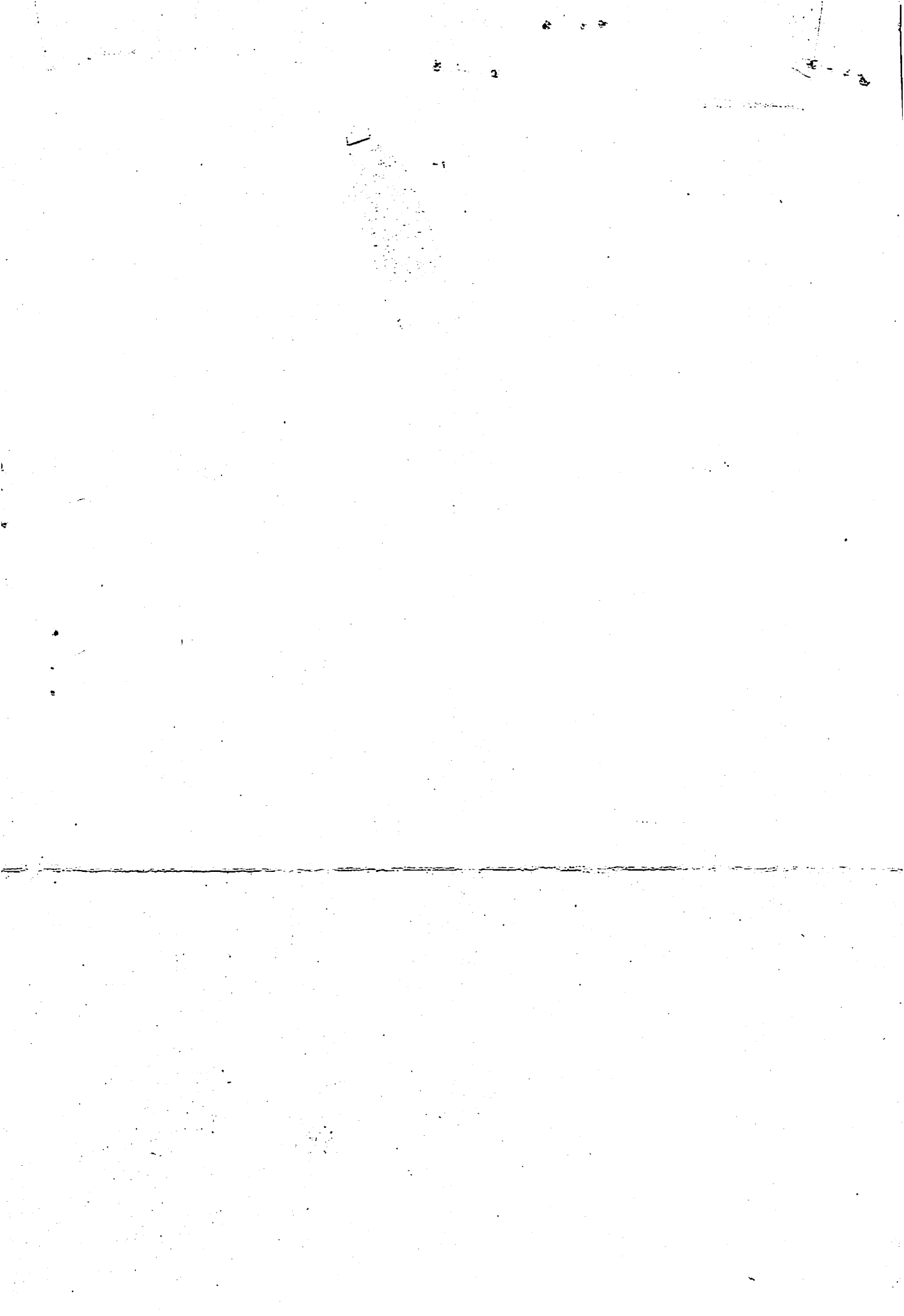

Proclam LawDay: Mayor Fitzgerald made the following proclamation:
WHEREAS, the dual observances this year for Law Day USA and the opening of the nations Bicentennial celebrations for 1975 and 1976 will be noted on May 1st,
BE IT RESOLVED THAT, May 1, 1975 shall be noted as Law Day in the Village of Palmyra and the Police Department of the Village of Palmyra, along with the Auxiliary Police, Sheriff's Department, State Police and any and all persons involved with Police work in the Village of Palmyra shall be recognized by each and every member of the community for their untiring devotion to duty for the safety and protection of all.

Policy State. Hsg. & Urb. Ren: Mayor Fitzgerald commented that he felt it apropos that a Policy Statement between the Housing Authority and the Urban Renewal Agency be formulated. Board suggested that Mayor Fitzgerald prepare a letter which should be sent to HUD by him in this regard.

Comm. Ctr: James Campbell, Director (full-time) of the Community Center advised that the directors of the Center would like to instigate again this year an Arts & Crafts Program in the summer. An additional sum of \$200.00 from the village would be required along with the same amount from the Town of Palmyra. There are about 50 children involved in such a program. They each pay a nominal sum toward the supplies but this does not cover all costs involved. Board advised that such a request would probably be honored.

H. Smith Canand. St.: Miss Helen Smith, owner of property at the corner of Canandaigua Street and East Jackson, southeast corner, informed the board that this corner seems to be "catch-all" for all the poles, both electric and telephone, as well as the new post which holds the control box for the traffic light, on this corner and could be considered as visual pollution. She commented that the traffic is heaviest when the light is not working. In view of the fact that there is a school crossing, it seemed superfluous to have a light.

Mayor Fitzgerald commented that the light has been placed here to slow down the traffic, especially from the south. Miss Smith advised that there is also a Route 21 sign on the area between the sidewalk and curb, in front of her property. Trustee McGuire commented that he would ascertain if it might be possible to move this farther to the south.
