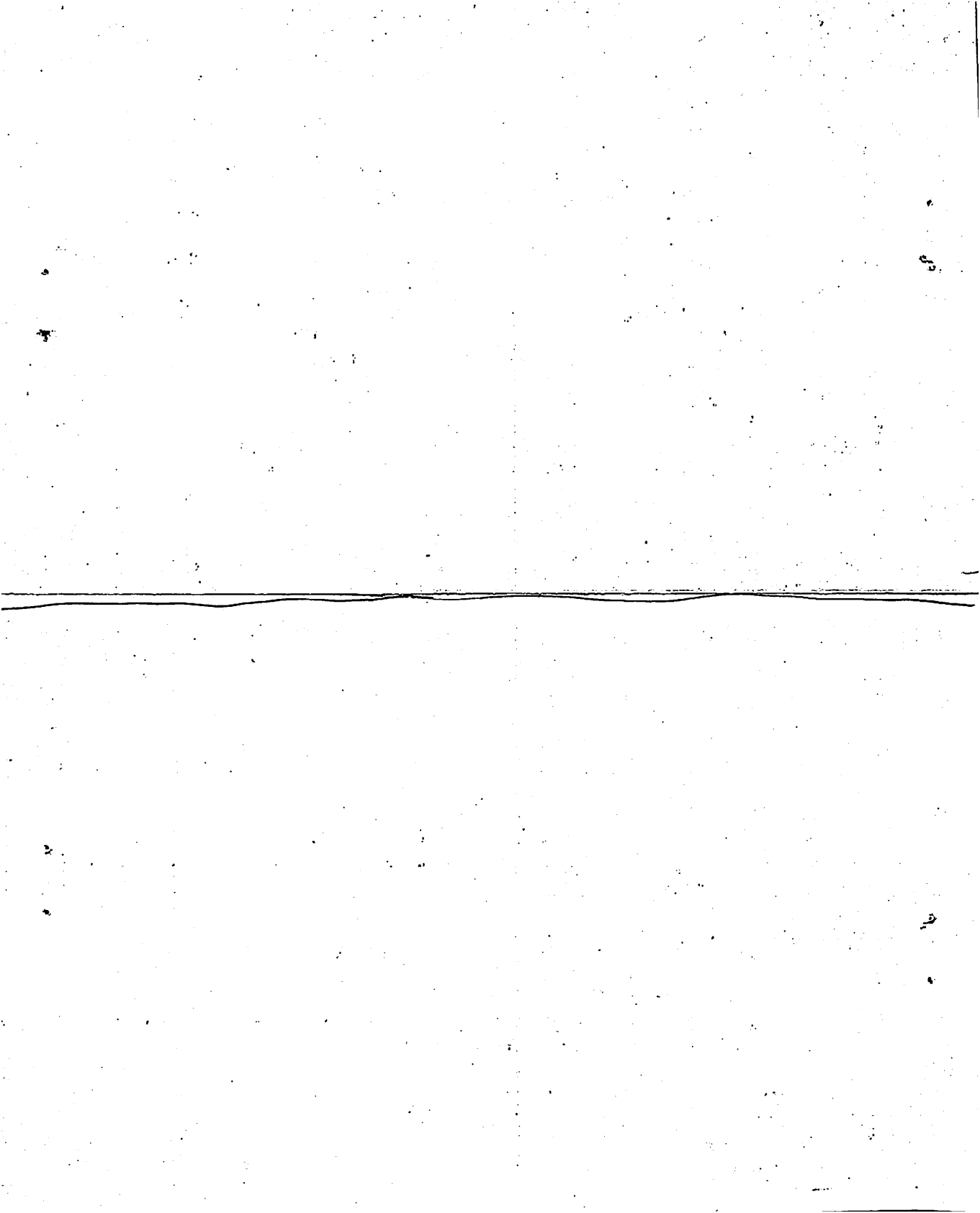

Village as follows:

Section 25-5 of the Code of the Village of Palmyra is hereby amended to read as follows:

§ 25.5 PARKING ZONES.

Vehicles shall be parked diagonal to the curb and with the front part of such vehicle next to the curb on East Main Street, on the north side from its intersection with Williams Street to its intersection with Market Street, and on the south side of East Main Street from its intersection with Cuyler Street to its intersection with Fayette Street. Within all other parking zones or portions hereof, vehicles shall be parked only parallel with the curb or sidewalk, headed in the direction of traffic, and with front and rear wheels not more than six (6) inches from the curb. The parking or standing of any vehicle except within a space so marked within any of said zones and in the manner above set forth is hereby prohibited.

This local law shall take effect upon the date of filing in the office of the Secretary of State.



## Regular Board Meeting

## Board of Trustees

7:00 P.M.

- Present:** Mayor Sidney J. Fitzgerald and Trustees Warner Strong, Lloyd A. Green, Mary Lou Wilson. Absent, Trustee David McGuire. Absent, Village Attorney Laura Jane Poyzer.
- 2 Min. Silence:** Mayor Fitzgerald opened the meeting with a two-minute period of silence.
- Vouchers:** Motion by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee Wilson and carried, to authorize the treasurer to pay the bills in the amount of \$31,757.32.
- Minutes:** Motion by Trustee Wilson, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried, to approve the minutes of the previous meeting.
- Waterline Intake Inspect.:** Water Plant Operator, Hiram VanEtten, informed the board that an inspection was made by Monroe Contracts on September 16, 1974 of the water line beginning at the shore of Canandaigua Lake into the lake itself to the intake. They advised that the line itself is in good shape, with the intake about 5,000 feet from the shore. There are six (6) cones through which the water gushes that should be cleaned. There are bolts that have become corroded and should be replaced. Trustee Strong commented that H. VanEtten should be authorized to contact Lozier Engineers, who in turn might recommend a suggested price for the cleaning of cones.
- Sewer Plant Blacktop:** Sewer Plant Operator, H. VanEtten, advised that the roadway to the sewer plant has been resurfaced. However, there are one or two spots, he continued, that are not properly set. Mr. VanEtten indicated that it may be that he expected a finer, smooth finish. He had contacted Kissienger, the contractor, who in turn did send some workers. However, Mr. VanEtten feels that the contractor himself, should view the work.
- Wise Request:** Water Plant Operator VanEtten informed the board that there is a possibility that "Wise Die Casting", Manchester, N.Y., may be requesting permission to connect to the raw water line owned by the village.
- Flag Pole:** H. VanEtten advised that he had found marine rope at 15¢/ft. which might prove satisfactory for raising and lowering the flag on the steel flag pole. Discussion relative to the possibility of attaching extra cleats on the pole was mulled over.
- Propos. Loc. Law #6, 1974:** Clerk advised that Attorney Poyzer had prepared the attached proposed Local Law #6, 1974, relative to parallel parking between Cuyler and Canandaigua Street on the south side of East Main and between William and Church Street on the north side of East Main with diagonal parking allowed between Cuyler and Fayette on East Main and between William and Market on East Main. Motion by Trustee Wilson, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried, to set a Public Hearing for October 7, 1974.



- Town Fire Contract:** On motion by Trustee Wilson, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried, to authorize the Mayor to sign the contract in behalf of the Village of Palmyra, which stipulates that the Town of Palmyra shall pay the Village of Palmyra the sum of \$10,000.00 in 1975 and the sum of \$12,000.00 in 1976.
- Manchester Water Contract:** Attorney Poyzer advised by memo that she had had no direct word from the Village of Manchester regarding the water contract. However, in talking with one of the trustees, he had intimated that the contract appeared to be "okay" except that they, the trustees, hoped that the price was not firm.
- Jail Fire Protection:** A quotation was received from Penfield Electric, Inc., Penfield, N.Y. in the amount of \$1,450.00 for a Fire Alarm Smoke Detector System in the Jail. Trustee Green suggested referring the quotation to Trustee McGuire, who was absent, for his perusal.
- Village Manager:** Review of replies from Saranac Lake and Gouvenor by Mayor Fitzgerald. Trustee Green suggested that a committee be appointed to study the matter. Mayor Fitzgerald commented that the board members were to write down memos regarding their desires in the matter, outlining any suggested qualification. General discussion ensued. The following motion was made by Trustee Green:  
**WHEREAS, THE VILLAGE OF PALMYRA,** has deemed that it might be advisable to have a village manager form of government,  
**BE IT RESOLVED THAT,** a feasibility study be made in order to change to this type of government.  
 No second.  
 Trustee Green withdrew the above resolution.
- The following motion was made by Trustee Green; 2nd by Trustee Strong.  
**WHEREAS,** the Village of Palmyra has deemed it might be advisable to have a Village Manager type of government,  
**BE IT RESOLVED THAT,** the Village of Palmyra shall make preparations to change to a Village Manager form of government, with the duties and qualifications of a person to be employed to be set forth at a later time.

- Arch. Rev. Committee:** Mayor Fitzgerald advised that an Architectural Committee had recently met and are forming some regulations to be presented to the Village Board.
- Narcotic Council:** Trustee Green advised that the Narcotic Council had advised that they felt the purpose for which they had been appointed in 1970 has now been completed and it was their recommendation that the council be disbanded. The attached formal resolution was proposed by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee Wilson and carried. Resolution on Page 165.
- Executive Session:** Motion was made by Trustee Wilson that the Board of Trustees move into an Executive Session at 8:45 P.M. Motion died for lack of a second.
- Pal. Vol. Amb. & Pal. Oxy. Sqd. Discussion:** Mayor Fitzgerald advised that recently disagreements had arisen between the Palmyra Volunteer Ambulance and the Palmyra Oxygen Squad, the latter being a subsidiary of the Palmyra Fire Company, Inc. Mayor Fitzgerald commented on the excellent service to the community both of these organizations perform, the Oxygen Squad having serviced the area for more than 25 years and the Palmyra Volunteer Ambulance since 1971. While the Palmyra Volunteer Ambulance does have a written agreement with the Village of Palmyra, the Oxygen Squad, a part of the village fire department, never has. Perhaps, he continued it would be apropos that both groups should draw agreements.

- PVA & Pal. Oxy. Squad:** (Cont'd) Mayor Fitzgerald suggested that a member or two members from each of these groups might be appointed who in turn could confer with Village Attorney, Laura Jane Poyzer, to draft a workable agreement. A letter was received from Mrs. Carolyn Hall, Maple Avenue, Palmyra, N.Y., praising the work of the Palmyra Oxygen Squad as well as the Volunteer Ambulance. The main question seems to be "What is best for the people?" Motion by Trustee Strong that a letter be written to both the Palmyra Oxygen Squad and the Palmyra Volunteer Ambulance suggesting that each group appoint two members to confer with village attorney, Laura Jane Poyzer, relative to a workable solution for both. Motion 2nd by Trustee Green and carried.
- Tree Removals:** Clerk advised that there were many dead trees in the cemetery, 14 of which should be removed in the immediate future. A quotation was received from Empire Tree Surgeons, Newark, N.Y. for the removal of the 14 and stumps, with the exception of three (3) stumps that it would be impossible to grind out because of graves, at a cost of \$1,484.00. Motion by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee Wilson and carried, to accept this quotation. There are approximately 28 trees and stumps to be removed within the village streets. A quotation of \$1,500.00 was received from Empire Tree Surgeons. Motion by Trustee Wilson, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried, to accept this quotation.
- Public Records:** Mayor advised that Attorney Poyzer had received a letter from an insurance company, but until such time as the complete information on the matter has been revealed to the board, Mayor Fitzgerald advised that it would not become a public record.
- Complaint:** Mrs. DeVuyst, Mill Street, advised Mayor Fitzgerald that at the time of heavy rains, her driveway and lawn area seems to be a catch-all for the water that comes from Johnson Street and Prospect Hill. Mayor Fitzgerald advised that he would confer with Highway Foreman Smith to determine if there might be a solution.
- Burnham Heights:** Trustee Green commented that it would be his suggestion that a complete resurface be done on Burnham Heights, with the Town of Macedon, sharing 40% of the cost. Clerk asked to obtain some figures for such a resurface bid.
- Fire Dept.:** Trustee Wilson commented that the board should either accept or reject the squad car bid. Mayor Fitzgerald advised that he would call a Special Meeting of the Board for September 30, 1974 at 7:00 P.M.E.D.S.T. at which time the matter would be resolved.
- Civil Service Assoc.:** A letter received by Mayor Fitzgerald advised that the Village of Palmyra Employees wished to join the Civil Service Association for representation by this body of the twelve (12) employees who have signed cards for membership. Clerk advised as members of the New York State Conference of Mayors, we also have subscribed to an additional service headed by Mr. Benjamin Werne, who would act as intermediary for the village in relation to any labor problems. Clerk asked to contact the conference and/or Mr. Werne for information.
- Pal. Fire Dept.:** A letter received by the Mayor from the Palmyra Fire Company, advised that National Fire Prevention Week will be from October 6, 1974, with the annual inspection on October 13th at 9:30 A.M., to which all board members are invited to attend.
- Assessor:** It was noted that the State Report to the State Board of Equalization and Assessment has not been filed. The Town will be asked to contact the Assessor, Robert Kirchhoff, to complete this report in view of the fact that the Village of Palmyra uses the assessment figures for village assessment procured from the town rolls.

Notice is hereby given by the Planning Board of the Village of Palmyra that the Planning Board will hold a Public Hearing at the Park & Club Building, 149 East Main Street, Palmyra, New York, on September 17, 1974, at 7:00 P.M. o'clock for the purposes of considering an amended Urban Renewal Plan which provides for certain modification to the Urban Renewal Plan for the Main Street Urban Renewal Area, No. N.Y. R-212, said Urban Renewal Plan being previously approved by the Planning Board on September 3, 1969.

Modifications under consideration include:

1. Deletion of certain properties from the project area, which properties are identified on the revised Project Boundary and Land Acquisition Map.
2. Addition of one property to the project area for acquisition owned by John Bain, which property is identified on the Project Boundary and Land Acquisition Map.
3. Changes in proposed land uses to identify residential for the elderly and public use areas.
4. Changes to building controls including lot coverage, building height and setback requirements and the establishment of building regulations of residential for the elderly usage.

5. Establishment of parking requirements for residential for the elderly usage.

6. Elimination of off-street loading requirements for residential uses.

7. Deletion of Minimum Property Rehabilitation Standards.

The Amended Urban Renewal Plan together with appropriate maps is on file at the Village Clerk's office and is available for public inspection.

The Amended Main Street Urban Renewal Area is more particularly described as follows:

Located in the Village of Palmyra, County of Wayne, State of New York, and bounded generally as follows:

BEGINNING at the intersection of the westerly line of William Street and the southerly line of Canal Street; thence west along the southerly line of Canal Street approximately 65 feet to a point; thence north from said point across Canal Street and continuing along a property line to the southerly line of the former Erie Canal right-of-way; thence east along the southerly line of the former Erie Canal right-of-way for a distance of approximately 396.9 feet to a property line; thence north along said property line for a distance of approximately 43.7 feet to a line; thence east along said line to the easterly line of Division Street; thence south along the easterly line of Division Street to the northerly line of Canal Street; thence southeast along the northerly line of Canal Street to the easterly line of Market Street, as extended; thence south along the easterly line of Market Street to the intersection of a property line, as extended; said property line being approximately 364 feet from the south line of Canal Street; thence west along said property line for a distance of approximately 91.5 feet to a property line; thence south approximately 6.5 feet to a property line; thence west approximately 28 feet to a property line; thence

**Community Facility:** A letter sent to Trustee Strong from Lozier, Engineers, Rochester, N.Y., indicated that they would be willing to make a preliminary survey at no charge for drafting of plans for a community facility.

**Invest. Counselor:** A letter from Bernard P. Donegan, Inc., P.O. Box 9425, Rochester, N.Y. 14604, enclosed schedules for the possible financing of \$250,000.00 in bonds. His fee for this service would be approximately \$2,300.00 plus expenses and the bond printing cost. This would be in connection with the bond anticipation note in the amount of \$125,000.00 for the extension of the sewer main on East Foster and Howell, and for the balance of the bond anticipation note in the amount of \$150,000.00 for the updating of the sewer plant, part of which of the \$150,000.00 will be retired or paid in December, 1974, from extra funds recently received from the federal government.

**Lozier Mkt. St. & Wm. St.:** Board agreed that in view of the fact that the Urban Renewal project will be resurfacing, curbing, and installing sidewalks on the north end of William and Market Street, it would be apropos if the board instructed Lozier's to obtain a figure for the completion of these streets to Main Street.

**Lower Sewer:** Richard Hill, 117 Washington Street, advised by letter that they will no longer be renting a part of their house. Therefore, they request that the sewer rate be lowered. Motion by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee Wilson and carried, to grant the reduction of the sewer from \$25.92 to \$17.28 beginning with the December 1, 1974 bill.

**Debt Exclusion:** Legal for the filing of the Debt Exclusion in the amount of \$720,000.00 for the sewage treatment plant is so attached.

**Silence:** Meeting was opened with a two-minute silence.

**Vouchers:** Motion by Trustee Green, 2nd by Trustee McGuire and carried, to authorize the treasurer to pay the vouchers in the amount of \$112,738.41.

**Minutes:** Motion by Trustee McGuire, 2nd by Trustee Green and carried, to approve the minutes of the previous meeting.

**Police Report:** Motion by Trustee McGuire, 2nd by Trustee Wilson and carried, to accept the Police Report for the month of September, 1974. Highlights of the report revealed complaints numbered 175; 12 speeders, and 13 noted for illegal parking. Total fines and bail forfeitures for motor vehicle and criminal arrests totalled \$570.00.

**Mkt. & Wm. Sts.:** A letter received from Wayne Ackert, Lozier Engineers, Rochester, advised the board that it would be too late in the season for any contractor to consider resurfacing, laying sidewalk and curbs to finish off these two streets, the northern strip of which have been done by Urban Renewal, but the balance of the southern end, approximately 300' +, each street, one side, should be finished by the village.

**Urb. Ren.** Mayor Fitzgerald reviewed the work that has been completed, including electrical lines that have been buried. However, walks are still not finished and driveways will need to be tilted to the sidewalk. Granite curbing is in place and the streets themselves are in. Mayor Fitzgerald further commented that the area is about ready for assessment valuation. He added that he had conferred with Urban Renewal Director William Roche and Housing Authority Chairman Thomas Zani, on this facet.

**Mkt. St. 1-Way:** The Village Board, he added, should be considering whether it would be feasible to make Market Street a ONE-WAY STREET, as it presently is, or only part way at the former C. Smith property, now the property of the Village of Palmyra, allowing the Urban Renewal Section, which is now enlarged to be a 2-Way Street. The retaining wall on the south end has waves in it, but the contractor has agreed that this will be repaired. There are 3 new electric light fixtures 50 to 60' apart on the east side.
