The report of cemetery collections from June 21st to August 6th., 1954 in amount of \$126.75 was ordered received and filed.

An application received from Mr. Arthur D. Trautman requesting permission to connect a surface drain at his property at 121 West Charlotte Ave., to the storm sewer was approved and permit signed by President James R. Webster.

The report received from Mr. Henry B. Nesbitt, Police Justice, showing fines in amount of \$125.00 collected during the month of July, 1954 was ordered filed.

A check in amount of \$101.00 was received from the Union Trust Co. upon claim made and signed by President James R. Webster. This check represents the amount of a cashier's check purchased by Mr. George E. Heath, Police Justice, on February 13th., 1933 in favor of the Village of Palmyra. For some unknown reason, the original check was never received by the Village and the \$101.00 was held by the Union Trust Company since above date.

Applications for water service received from Edward Dickenson, Birdsall Parkway and William Kaveny of Railroad Ave., were received and approved.

The Clerk was instructed to place an order with Roger M. Bartlett, 941 Gaywood Lane Webster, N. Y. for 250 feet of Flexseal, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  inch treated D.S. fire hose with plylock ends #80 drop forged couplings at a cost of \$525.00 less trade in of used hose, \$95.00 or a net cost of \$430.00.

Mr. Leland McIntire made application for a new sidewalk in front of his property on west side of Fayette street. The Board approved his application.

The Clerk was directed to advise the Davey tree Expert's foreman that the Board had decided not to remove the trees in the cemetery at present and ask that he so advise Mr. Bowen.

The clerk was instructed to order 500 sets of Uniform Traffic tickets and 4 books to carry same in at a cost of \$31.50

An application for water connection together with a check in amount of \$85.00 was received from Mr. Curtis O'Connor of Maple Avenue Water District, same was approved.

The Clerk was directed to have mimeographed copies made of the legal notice recently published in the Palmyra Courier relative to water service restrictions outside the Village and mail same to each person obtaining water from the Village water system living outside of the Village and not in an organized water District.

LOCAL NOTICE - WATER SERVICE RESTRICTIONS OUTSIDE OF VILLAGE

Several years ago, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra adopted a resolution providing that in the future municipal water service would not be furnished outside of the Village, and that no further connections would be made to any privately owned pipe or main outside of the Village, and that no person receiving service should permit any other resident or property owner to take water from a non service pipe. Residents and property owners in a locally organized water district were exempt from these restrictions.

It was also provided that persons then obtaining water from the village system and living outside of the Village should have a reasonable time to either organize a district or obtain a supply of water elsewhere, and after a reasonable time service would be discontinued to persons who failed to comply.

Notice of the above general rules was given at the time, but unfortunately some persons have ignored or failed to read these rules. Some persons have bought houses and in some instances bought trailers, and after being refused water service have been very disappointed. Others have made no effort to either form a water district or provide for water service of their own.

The Board of Trustees does not intend to cease to provide water service for a reasonable time to residents who were receiving water from the village system when the foregoing policy was established, but the Board is of the opinion that people have had a reasonable time within which to comply, and only part of the people receiving such service have complied.

Service furnished to people who are not in an organized water district have no assurance of service which for the most part is through small pipes or makeshift arrangements, and neither the Village or town are in any way responsible for the maintenance of such pipes or mains, nor are anyone responsible, which makes a most unsatisfactory situation. When leaks or breaks develop the water is wasted and the Village collects no revenue, and the Village will neither repair such lines nor continue to furnish water in the future once such a condition is brought to its attention.

Residents obtain a somewhat cheaper rate in organized water districts and there is an organization responsible for the maintenance and servicing of the water mains in the public highway. Many persons who desire to build homes outside of the Village are unwilling to invest their money with no assurance of water.

The Board of Trustees desire everyone concerned to realize that the policies established some years ago by prior Village boards are still in effect and will be enforced.

The application received from Mr. George Brandetsas requesting the Village Board to have the sidewalk in front of his place of business removed and replaced with a new walk with the understanding that he pay 50% of the cost, was approved by the Board but under the following conditions: The cost for this work as charged by the Village is 55 cents per square foot. While the Board does not feel that the highway department will be able to do this work this year, the Board will agree to pay 27½ cents per square foot to Mr. Brandetsas or to an individual contractor, but shall not agree to pay more than 27½ cents per square foot, regardless of the price charged by the contractor. The Clerk was instructed to advise Mr. Brandetsas accordingly.

Mr. Contant moved that Wallace J. Beatty be authorized to renew two fire policies on the Village Hall, one fire policy on the water works building and equipment and one fire policy on Village Garage #2, all of which present policies will expire in September, seconded by Mr. Johnson and on motion carried.

Mr. Scribner was advised that some complaints had been received regarding his personal conduct as Officer in charge of the Department and was told that the Board had decided to give him a three months extension with the understanding that if certain conditions were not corrected and he had not proven his ability to head the Department at the end of that period, the Board might find it necessary to make a change.

No further business appearing, the minutes were read, and on motion by Mr. Johnson, seconded by Mr. Jeffery, same were approved.

The Surety bond issued by the Metropolitan Casualty Co., in amount of \$1000.00 covering W. Ray Converse, principal, as Assistant Police Justice was inspected by the Board members and approved.
