At 11:15 P.M. the car was found at the Locks on West Main Street by Officer Smith with Patrolman Trowbridge asleep in the car. Officer Smith then waited for Police Chief Henry to arrive.

F.Trowbridge Reports: Patrolman Fred Trowbridge advised that the story is basically the same. He did drop LaJoie off and as he went through town on west side noted that his eyes were very tired. He turned off the engine of the car. He was advised by low ban that a man was going out of the station to check door on East Main Street. He did not hear radio calling in the car for him. The officers had to arouse him to get him awake. He then went home with Officer Smith.



Attorney Sapienza:

Agreed on the legal basis. Commented that a lot has happened. There has been confusion over the status of Fred, with the news media giving coverage. Certainly, he said, no one condones this incident, but that it has been blown out of proportion. It would appear that we are now back to the original starting point. The initial shock was that he was out of contact for two and one-half hours, which was untrue. Actually, 45 minutes was the longest that village was not responding. The real issue is not that we were out of contact with the sheriff's department, as Trowbridge dropped a man off at the Police Station at 10:30 P.M., and only ten to fifteen (10-15) minutes later should have picked up a man at his home.

Richardson Comm.: Acting Police Justice, Charles Richardson commented that he has not acted without Police Justice Rubery's knowledge. The cases on his docket (Richardson's), he continued, have been turned over to Police Justice Rubery, with a few exceptions. Is it legal for Police Justice Rubery to take over cases started by Acting Police Justice Richardson and if it is, do both Village gerald: Attorney Poyzer and District Attorney Sirkin agree with this?
